Discussion Questions

- During this quarantine, what's something that you miss that surprises you? What's something that you don't miss that surprises you?
- What did God teach you through the sermon this weekend?
- Read 2 Timothy 4, the last letter Paul wrote to a young pastor he's mentored, where Paul shares his hopes and challenges to his friend to live for Jesus and love others well.
 - What stands out to you about this passage?
 - What can we learn from Paul about living on mission for Jesus?
- Which of the four necessities Paul shares for living on mission do you need to focus on or grow in? Why?
 - We have to know who's work it is
 - We must stick with the Word
 - We must take the work personally
 - We must run all the way across the finish line

- When have you ever said yes to something God was urging you to do for which you felt unprepared? What was the impact of that experience on your faith?
- What opportunities do you sense God opening for you to live out the great commission? What obstacles do you face to say 'yes' and take this charge seriously?
- What's one thing you can do today to live out the great commission? How can we as a group encourage you in that?
